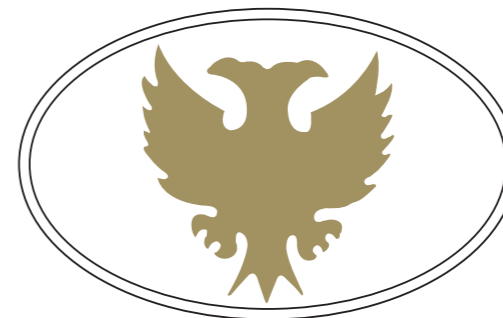

The Falmouth Hotel is the most enduring hotel in the popular maritime resort of Falmouth, known as one of the world’s great natural harbours.

Built in 1863, it was Falmouth’s first hotel and remains today the epitome of graceful Victorian style. Over the years, the Hotel has had an illustrious history, having

played host to a long list of famous names - from royalty, to pop and film stars.

The Falmouth’ is set in five acres of beautifully landscaped gardens and enjoys a prime location on the seafront, opposite a sandy beach. The chateau-like structure is further enhanced by views over Pendennis Castle, the headland, harbour and out to infinite sea.

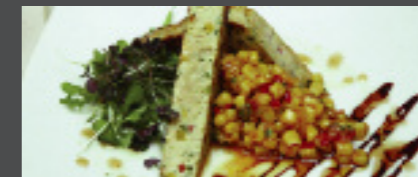

Lunches, a comprehensive bar menu and traditional Afternoon Teas are also available.

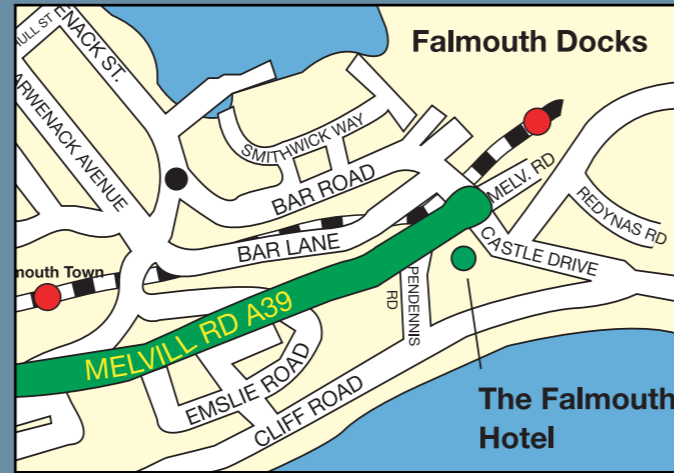

How to reach us:

On entering Falmouth via the A39 bypass, proceed up Dracaena Avenue (A39) until you reach a roundabout, go straight over the roundabout and proceed along Western Terrace (A39) until you reach the next roundabout.

Again go straight over this roundabout onto Melvill Road (A39) and continue straight to the end of Melvill Road where you will find another roundabout, The Falmouth Hotel is on your right.
